Challenges to Working from Home


Purpose and Methodology

- An online survey study was completed in order to measure perceived challenges to working from home besides interruptions from household members and not having a job that would be applicable.
- A total of 1,563 Iowa Opinion Panel (IOP) members mostly residing in Iowa, some from adjacent states - completed the survey during May 2022.



Top Challenges

The most common challenges selected were maintaining relationships with colleagues and work life bleeding into personal life. Many participants believed there were no challenges to working from home or that the only challenges were interruptions from household members.




Segmentations

- The results were further analyzed by demographic variables
 - Gender
 - Age
 - Household Income
- The demographic variables are not unrelated
 - Women have lower household incomes than men on average
 - Household income increases, then decreases, as people age
- Charts focus on challenges that showed significant differences




Challenges by Gender

Men were more likely than women to select *maintaining relationships with colleagues* as the top challenge to working from home, while women were more likely than men to select *not having all of the same equipment available.*




There was a trend for participants to be more likely to select *maintaining relationships with colleagues* as their age increased.



Maintaining relationships with colleagues




There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *not having a good setup for working* as their age increased.



Not having a good setup for working (e.g., no dedicated space, no desk)




There was a trend for participants to be more likely to select *not having all of the same equipment available* as their age increased up to age 50.



Not having all of the same equipment available




There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *lack of motivation* as their age increased.



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
There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *too many distractions* as their age increased up to around age 50.



Too many distractions (e.g., TV to watch, games to play)




Participants were fairly consistent in their likelihood to select *my work life bleeding into my personal life* across all age groups.



My work life bleeding into my personal life




Participants were fairly consistent in their likelihood to have/see no challenges across age groups except for participants younger than 30, who nearly all selected a challenge.



I have or would have no challenges working from home besides household member interruptions




There was a trend for participants to be more likely to select *maintaining relationships with colleagues* as their household income increased.



Maintaining relationships with colleagues




There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *not having a good setup for working* as their household income increased.



Not having a good setup for working (e.g., no dedicated space, no desk)




Participants with household incomes larger than \$150k were less likely to select not having all of the same equipment available.




Not having all of the same equipment available



There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *lack of motivation* as their household income increased.




There was a trend for participants to be less likely to select *too many distractions* as their household income increased, especially through \$50k.



Too many distractions (e.g., TV to watch, games to play)




Participants were more likely to select *my work life bleeding into my personal life* as household income increased.

Participants were fairly consistent in their likelihood to have/see no challenges to working from home as their household income increased. Participants with household incomes greater than \$200k were most likely to select a challenge.
